CHAMPION CLUB COMPETITION

From 2006-2007 Season

A. CRITERIA

- 1. **Administration** 15 points maximum
- 1.1 President and Delegate attendance at monthly meetings or two proxies.
- 1.2 Return of Patrol Service Agreement and Roster by closing date.
- 1.3 Attendance of Clubs at Conferences/Seminars
- 1.4 Reports returned to Director of Administration by due date. (*Branch Office to monitor this section.* Clubs to be advised when returns form part of competition.)
- 2. **Membership Retention** 15 points maximum
- 2.1 Total number of Cadets, Junior and Senior Active Members, Reserve Active and Long Service Members from the previous season compared with the total number of these members from this current season,
- 3. **Lifesaving Awards** 15 points maximum
- 3.1 Total Bronze Medallions, Surf Rescue Certificates, Advanced Resuscitation Certificates, Silver Medallion IRB Drivers Certificates, IRB Crewmans Certificates and Silver Medallion Patrol Captain Certificates gained by each Club for the season (weighted) and given double points.
- 3.2 Total other awards except Resuscitation Certificate and Radio Operators Certificates gained by each Club for the season (weighted) and given single points.
- 3.3 Total Resuscitation Certificates and Radio Operators Certificates gained by each Club for the season (weighted) and given half points.

The Club winning this overall section to be awarded the prize "Most Awards Gained during the Year" at the Branch presentation night.

- 4. **Patrol Efficiency** 15 points maximum
- 4.1 Results of Patrol Efficiency Competition (Best 4 scores to be used)
- 5. **Lifesaving Participation** 15 points maximum
- 5.1 Lifesaver of year and Volunteer of the Year five points be allocated to each Club nominating a participant in either category.
- 5.2 Result of Gear Inspection. Result of each Club's percentage of reinspections to total gear presented figure to be used.
- 5.3 Result of Lifesaving Premiership i.e. Patrol Competition Championship, First Aid Championships, Champion Lifesaver.
- 6. **SurfComm Participation**
- 6.1 Hours contributed by each Club member (weighted)
- 7. **Board of Lifesaving and Board of Surf Sports** 15 points maximum
- 7.1 Number of Board of Lifesaving or Board of Surf Sports members from Clubs officiating at examinations, proficiencies, carnivals or any other function (weighted). If a member has

nominated for an examination and the exam is cancelled, points are awarded. Further, if cancelled on the actual day only those attending be awarded points.

8. **Competition** – 15 points maximum

- 8.1 Results of each open carnival and the Branch Championships (using the handicap pointscore)
- 8.2 Result of Branch IRB Championships (if held)

9. **General Conditions**

- 9.1 The Champion Club can only receive the major prize (i.e. IRB Hull and Motor) once every three years, i.e. should a Club win consecutive years, they can only receive the prize once in that period.
- 9.2 The title Champion Club will remain with the winner.
- 9.3 The IRB Hull will be given to the second placegetter.
- 9.4 Notwithstanding the above, part of the major prize will go to the winner, e.g. fully equipped IRB-hull would go to the second placegetter and IRB motor to the winner. If the second placegetter has previously received the hull as a consolation then the hull will be given to the third placegetter. The interpretation of this part is that any one club cannot win the hull more than once in three years, but the Champion Club Winner could receive the motor three years in a row.
- 9.5 Nil points for nil participation in any area.
- 9.6 Weighting factor to be determined by using the prior year's Branch annual report figures for cadet, junior and senior active members. Weighting figures are calculated by dividing a Club's total active membership figure into the total active membership figure of the Club with the largest number of active members.
- 9.7 Monthly feedback to be given to Clubs not returning documentation on time.

B POINTS ALLOCATION

1. Administration

- 1.1 One point per person for attendance
- 1.2 One point if returned by closing date
- 1.3 One point for each attendee (up to required number of attendees)
- One point for each return requested by the closing date
 Combine 1.1, 1.2, 1.3 and 1.4 points together. Highest total awarded 15 points down to 1 point.

2. **Membership Retention**

2.1 Highest retention number awarded 15 points down to 1 point.

3. Lifesaving Awards

- 3.1 30 points down to 15 point
- 3.2 15 points down to 1 point
- 3.3 7.5 points down to 1/2 point

Combine 3.1, 3.2, and 3.3 points together. Highest total awarded 15 points down to 1 point.

4. **Patrol Efficiency**

4.1 Winning Club awarded 15 points down to 1 point.

5. **Lifesaving Participation**

- 5.1 5 points be allocated to each Club nominating a participant in either category.
- 5.2 Club with lowest percentage awarded 15 points down to 1 point
- 5.3 Pointscore kept (7.5 points for 1st place down to 1/2 point for 15th place, clubs awarded highest place points no block-out) for each competition. Winning pointscore awarded 7.5 points down to 1/2 point.

Combine 5.1, 5.2 and 5.3 points together. Highest total awarded 15 points down to 1 point.

6. **SurfComm Participation**

6.1 Highest total awarded 15 points down to 1 point.

7. Board of Lifesaving and Board of Surf Sports

7.1 1 point for each member's attendance. Highest total awarded 15 points down to 1 point.

8. **Competition**

- 8.1 Actual points added together
- 8.2 7.5 points for 1st place down to 1/2 point for 15th place, clubs gaining highest place points no block-out.

Combine points for 8.1 and 8.2. Highest total awarded 15 points down to 1 point.

C CHAMPION CLUB

- 1.1 Add points for Section 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 together. Highest total points, first place down to lowest points, fifteenth.
- 1.2 Dead Heats count back will apply in the following manner:
 - i) Combined Points for Sections 3, 4 and 5.
 - ii) Section 6
 - iii) Section 7
 - iv) Section 2
 - v) Section 1
 - vi) Section 8
