Incident

Multiple reports were received from members of the public about a kite surfer board floating off Cronulla Point near Shark Island. The board was located by the IRB crew from Cronulla with no rider in the near vicinity. Support Ski 1 & 2 with the assistance of Cronulla & Elouera IRB's commenced a line water search for the rider. The search was communicated over the radio with Surf Comm and the Lifeguards radio channels. The Lifeguards commenced a visual search of the Bate Bay area utilising CCTV cameras and binoculars from all 4 Lifeguard locations at Cronulla, North Cronulla, Elouera and Wanda towers. The Bate Bay area of water is about 20 square kilometers in size. Due to the area of water and the conditions of the sea on the day this was no easy seach.

During the water search, Mitch Keyon a Lifeguard in the tower at Elouera had observed something green in the water approximately 1 to 2 km out to see directly in front of Elouera beach. The line search was continued with the assistance of the Cronulla and Elouera IRB's and the Lifeguards then directed both Support Ski 1 & 2 to the location of the object in the water. The green object was the kite belonging to the missing surfer.

A male was found floating wearing his PFD a short distance from the kite and rescued by Support Ski 1 & 2. On speaking with the male he stated he had been in the water for more than 45 minutes since loosing his board and his kite tearing.

Weather conditions at the time of the search were poor with a large sea swell between 1 to 2.5 meters and gusting wind chop. Visibility was poor and the male could only be seen when Support Skis 1 & 2 where within 5 meters of the patient.

The male kite surfer was secured on the RWC sled and returned to the beach for a medical check. All his kite equipment was also recovered. The kite surfer was very happy to have been rescued and to be back on land where he thanked all involved in his rescue.

The RWC's and IRB's joined together to preform a line search for the missing kite board rider after locating the kite board. Due to the difficult swell, the skill of those on the water and the Lifeguards on the land was put to the test in the location of the missing kite surfer. The coordination of both Lifeguard and Surf Life Saving skills sets during this rescue resulted in the timely identification of the missing kite surfer and his rescue.

Yes. The RWC's and IRB's followed all SOPs during the search and rescue. Their actions were continually updated to surf comm via radio. The RWC were essential in the negotiating the large swell as well as there ability to cover a large area quickly.

The four patrolled beaches, Cronulla, North Cronulla, Elouera and Wanda are the patrolled component of the 20 square kilometer area of water know as Bate Bay. The swell was large and demanding which required the surf life savers to utilise all the skills learned during training and ongoing development.

The kite surfer had been in the water for 45 minutes, between 1 and 2km out to see when located. If his board was not located when it was, he could have remained in the water for a much longer period of time before becoming overdue and missing. The outcome had the potential to easily have had a much different outcome.
