PRESIDENT'S REPORT



The season commenced in August with setting the strategic direction for the management team and shifting the level of engagement with the rest of the organisation. During an offsite meeting the Board of Management team focused on strategic alignment and continuing to deliver on our core objectives. This required a major shift on how we would engage in order to achieve our desired outcomes.

A key area of focus was the setting of our strategic direction and delivering against it. This included a review of the portfolio structure, deliverables, ensuring results driven outcomes were achieved and a focus on innovation. This process included engagement and buy-in from the club Presidents agreeing on focus areas. As a part of this a number of clubs are currently working towards obtaining a bronze level in the quality club program which enables clubs to remain sustainable in the future. I would like to thank Peter Agnew for facilitating the strategy sessions ensuring alignment was achieved.

The operating model for the bi-monthly council meetings was changed from including the club Presidents and delegates to a more results driven and focused engagement model of having club Presidents and Directors in attendance. This change was agreed during the previous season however it was important to ensure SLSS was in a position of adding value and delivering results by direct engagement and creating an open environment allowing club Presidents to focus on major issues and strategic alignment.

While this has had a major effect on the focus of the council meetings and the outcome of the meetings, I would still like

to see club Presidents have the ability to engage more during these meetings to ensure we get to a position where we are able to openly discuss key issues affecting clubs agreeing on strong action plans which will ensure we have a sustainable future. Given this was the first season this change was undertaken, I suspect this will continue to improve and will start really delivering some great results.

I am pleased with the results the team has achieved with some key achievements delivered as a result of the focus applied during the season in the following areas:

Administration

A number of changes were achieved in the administrative area including change of staffing from a casual arrangement to a permanent status. This has provided the team with a level of commitment which is deserved by Linda and Victoria. A review of the accounts structure also took place streamlining the amount of work required to manage the accounts.

Innovation

Historically SLSS has been known for its innovative approach to the movement and I wanted to reinvigorate this area. There have been some key initiatives identified due to the focus on innovation.

Some notable areas include the provision of training sessions between the state and Australian championships, allowing our athletes the ability to train against other competitors in a relaxed environment. This proved to be very successful with and will now form part of the seasons surf sports calendar.

Given we have the most dangerous areas within our branch, we were successful in obtaining a grant from UPS to actively reduce the amount of deaths related to rock fishing. The team are currently looking at the production of an APP which will be available to the public for free and provide them with the ability to conduct a risk assessment prior to undertaking the activity. I would like to thank the UPS foundation for the approval of the application and awarding SLSS with the funds to innovatively focus on the reduction of the most dangerous sport in Australia.

Drone Technology is currently being investigated for possible use within SLSS in the areas of life saving and search and rescue in non patrolled areas, with initial trials proving to be very successful. SLSS is currently working with SLNSW and SLSA on how we can utilise this technology.

While the focus has been on strategy, we have remained diligent in our key areas achieving some great results in competition. We put in a terrific effort at the inter-branch championships, but unfortunately we came second to Sydney Northern Beaches. However, I am confident we will be able to reclaim this title again next season.

This year the SLSS Branch Championships were held at Maroubra SLSC as usual the club did an outstanding job in hosting the two day carnival, unfortunately the majority of the water events were cancelled due to dangerous surf conditions on both days, I would like to thank David Simpson President of Maroubra SLSC and his team for the continued level of support provided for this event.

Lifesaving and Education continue to deliver results with no lives lost between the flags and our Education team managing to deliver a high level of lifesaver to protect the bathing public on our beaches. The areas of youth and BJD continued to deliver outstanding results in running successful development programs ensuring we have a strong base of juniors and youth feeding into our senior organisation.

The SLSS Awards of Excellence was a very successful evening where we recognised the high achievement of our life savers across all disciplines. On a Life Saving front of worthy note were the SLSS Life Saver of the Year Rosie Taliano from North Bondi SLSC, Volunteer of the Year Craig Howie from Coogee SLSC, Rescue of the Year Lucas & Graham Toms from South Maroubra SLSC - Rescue conducted 31/8/2014, Assessor of the Year Craig Howie from Coogee SLSC, Branch Member of the Year Matthew Evans from Maroubra SLSC, BJD Female Life Saver of the Year Emily Maythers from North Cronulla SLSC, BJD Male Life Saver of the Year Jed Buckley from Wanda SLSC. On a competition front - Open Female Athlete of the Year Elly Graf from Elouera SLSC, Open Male Athlete of the Year Andrew Bowden from Bronte SLSC, Team of the Year Rescue Tube Rescue Team from Bronte SLSC. With the winning Club of the year being awarded to Maroubra SLSC. Given the high calibre of the Branch winners

I am sure we will be represented very well at the SLNSW Awards of Excellence evening held in August.

I must say this has been a very successful season in my first year as President and we have achieved a tremendous amount of change. The changes we made would not have been possible without the level of commitment and support from the Board of Management and the club Presidents.

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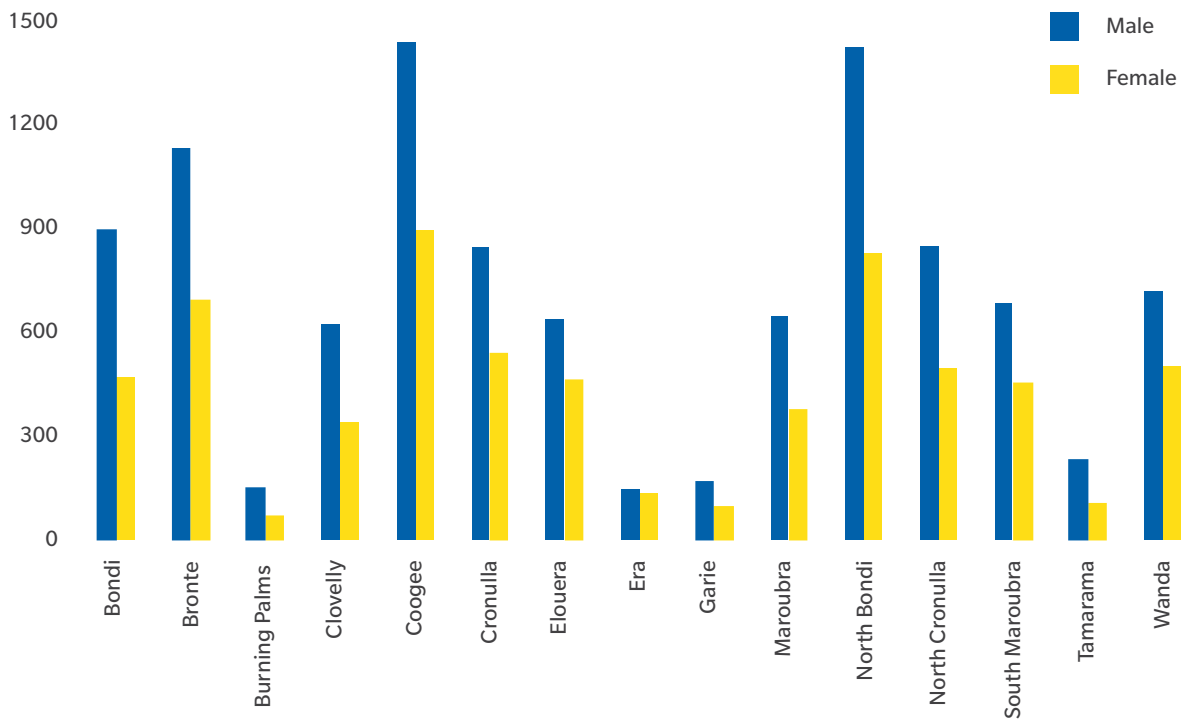




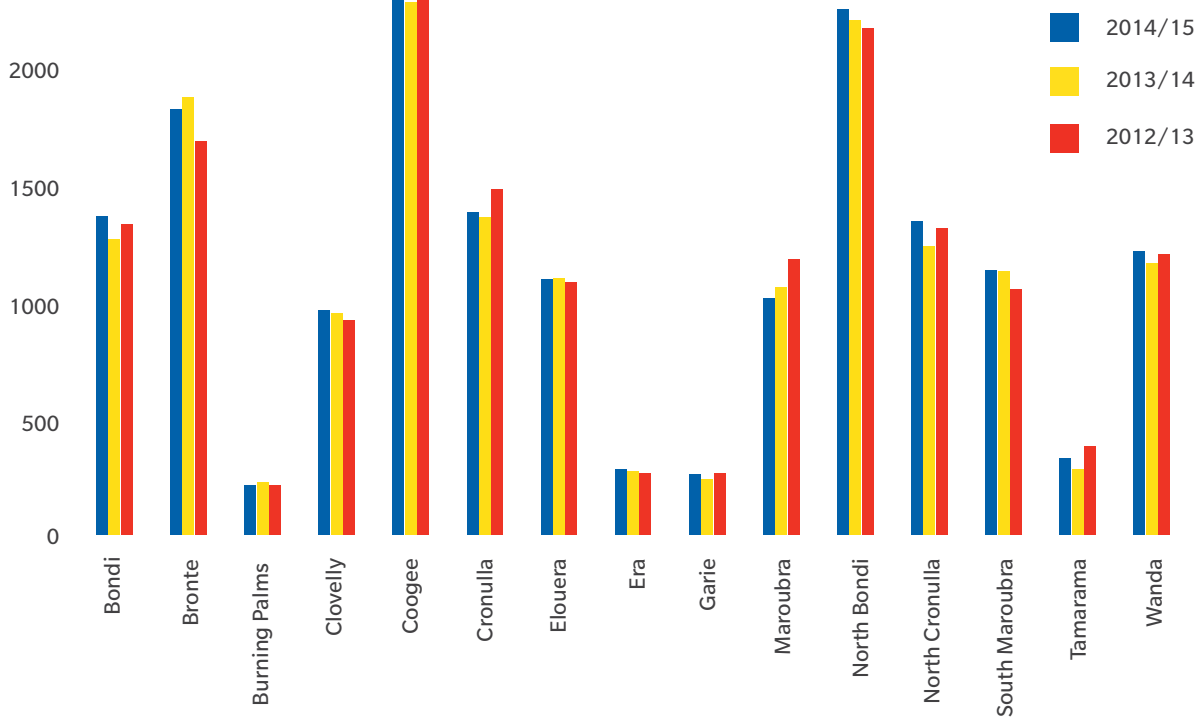

LIFESAVING AND EDUCATION



DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING



Our season has come to an end for 2014-15 and we prepare for the upcoming season with renewed enthusiasm. No lives lost between the flags.

Sydney Branch Lifesavers continue to protect patrolled beaches from Sydney Heads to National Parks as well as an extensive coastline with Support Skis and Offshore Rescue Boats operations.

Thank you to all clubs and lifesavers for a great job done this season.

In the 2014-15 season our statistics showed that the number people coming to our beaches had significantly increased which flowed through in our statistics. Our rescues were up by 62 across the Branch, but I can proudly say that there are 1346 individuals out there who returned home to their families from a day out at beach because of the dedicated and highly skilled lifesavers in this Branch.

Our First aids followed the same pattern with Marine stings and major wounds almost doubling, and our resuscitation incidents rose from 4 to 16 from the previous season.

Gathering our patrol statistical information is extremely important process while we are on the beach. This season, we discovered that different patrol captains have different interpretations / definitions of a Rescue, a prevention and first aid classification. The Board of Lifesaving has been working with SLNSW to clearly define these definitions, which we will pass on to clubs at the club Captain / CTO preseason meeting.

The Lifesaving, Education and support Operations teams have worked extremely hard the season, on how they engaged with

the clubs and SLNSW. This has provided the teams with some valuable insights, highlighting areas that are working well and others that may need improvement, innovation and change. I have listed below some of these areas we have looked at as a team:

- Updating and improving the RWC rostering system. This will incorporate the Duty Officer Roster and Off Shore Rescue Boat in the future.
- Review of the lead Assessor and Assessor rostering of Assessments.
- Introduction of Assessor uniforms across the Branch.
- Working with SLNSW to review the Education SOP's and code of conduct round assessments.
- The introduction of a gear stewards meeting prior to Gear Inspection, allowing new gear stewards to understand the process and expectations.
- Review of the structure of the Board of Lifesaving and its capabilities, along with meeting formats.
- Review and testing of Drone technology for possible use on our beaches.
- Our Education Manager and Advance Awards coordinator have worked incredibly hard to reduce the amount of face to face time for the Training Officer, Assessor and Silver Medallion Basic Beach Management awards.
- Member Recognition - In season 2015/16, Sydney Branch will be introducing a new system that will recognise the hours and effort our members do, on and off the beach.
- Continually reviewing Lifesaving and Education standards across the branch through out the season.

This season we saw the number of new Surf Rescue Certificates (SRC) increase from last season, but our Bronze medallion and higher awards dropped slightly in numbers from the previous season. Normally this would be a concern, but this season we saw our highest proficiency numbers across Bronze and our higher awards which allowed Sydney branch to maintain a high lifesaver skill level across our patrols.

Congratulations to our Rescue of the Month (ROM) winners. This season we had 3 state winners, with one going on to win the national award.

There are a number of people who need to be recognised and thanked for their contribution to maintaining our lifesaving operations and standards, firstly to Linda Perrin and Victoria Raymond from Branch Office who organise and process lifesaving operations, without them the Branch would be difficult to operate. Secondly the Board of Lifesaving and sub committees whose members assist Clubs in maintaining lifesaving standards, educational needs and lifesaving development throughout the branch.

The team has worked tirelessly throughout the season, often in the background, to provide support and guidance to our patrol teams, including responding to hundreds of incidents within the branch outside of normal patrol hours. At the end of this season, the group received its largest number of expressions of interest to join the groups training courses, which will be happening over the winter months. I look forward to working with Matthew and team, and on how we can improve our 24 x 7 lifesaving coverage in the branch in the upcoming season.

2014/15 was another successful season for Support Operations in Sydney. Some challenging taskings were undertaken both during and outside of patrol hours in often difficult conditions. It goes without saying that the calibre of the Sydney Support Operations Team is second to none.

The dedicated team of **Duty Officers and Rescue Coordinators** worked tirelessly throughout the season, often in the background, to provide support and guidance to patrol teams, SLS resources and external agencies during major incidents bringing together a coordinated response. This season has seen the Duty Officers move to a rostering system to ensure Clubs receive the highest level of support during patrol hours. The success of this will be continued into the future so that Clubs can be assured of the extra level of support when required.

Sydney's **RWC Team** has performed well this season supporting the clubs during rescues and responding on numerous occasions to taskings outside of club patrol areas. This second level of support provided has proved to be invaluable especially where speed and agility are key to a successful outcome. During the offseason we will continue to build this team by undertaking further training to ensure the RWC's can be available for more hours in the next season.

Surf Rescue 30 continued to provide 24/7 response within Sydney Branch as well as undertaking routine patrols. On numerous occasions SR30 was called upon to provide a rescue response by external agencies and SLS. The skill shown in the

access and treatment of patients is a testament to the ongoing training and commitment of this Team. Further training and assessments are planned to be undertaken to increase the membership of this vital cog of Sydney's Support Operations.

The focus will now shift to how clubs can be integrated into the 24/7 response capability to further strengthen our rescue response whilst ensuring our already established system is refined and maintained.

In closing I encourage any club member who is looking for alternate pathways in SLS to consider joining one of the Support Operations Teams in Sydney Branch. Keep an eye out for circulars advising when services are recruiting for members or make contact with myself or the RWC or ORB Advisor for details. It is definitely a rewarding path to take.

All current members are to be congratulated on a successful season delivering an additional layer of support to the traditional beach patrols. I look forward to another successful season ahead building on the strong base in place.

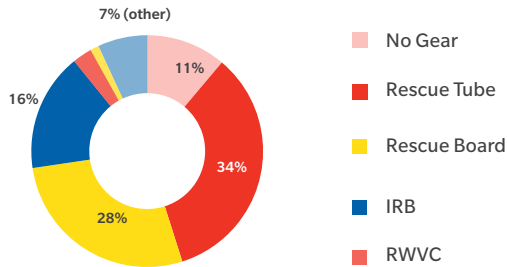

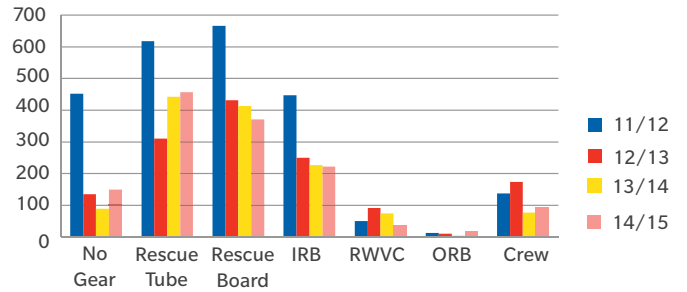

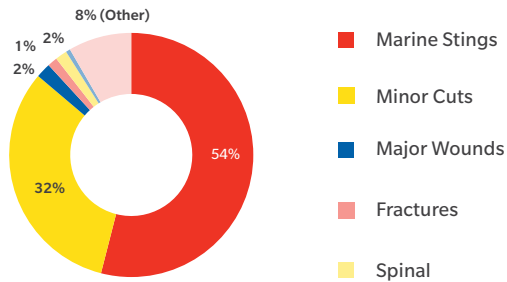
Total Rescues 1,346 Season 14/15



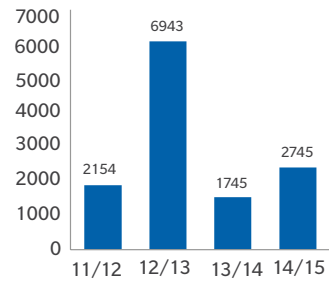
Total Rescues - 4 Year Comparison



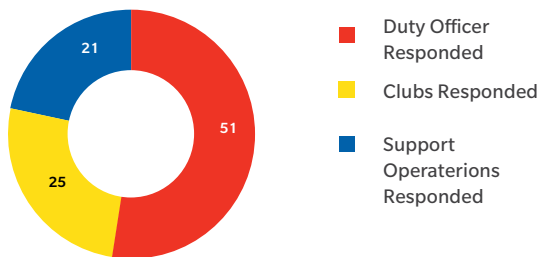
Total First Aid 2,745 Season 14/15



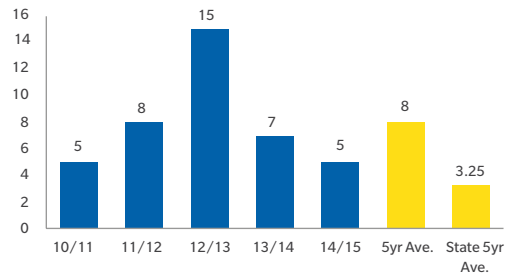
Total First Aid 4 Year Comparison



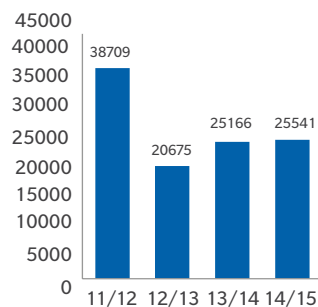
13SURF Incident Response 97 Season 14/15

The 2014-15 season was another impressive season for Education in Sydney Branch. The season started with our Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators having to complete another upgrade to a new set of Units of Competency. Some of our Assessors were required to complete four new Units of Competency. All up so far 183 members of Sydney Branch have completed these upgrades, which is a wonderful effort from all involved.

This season our Clubs have worked incredibly hard to achieve the number of awards which are displayed on the awards chart. This could not have happened without the hard work of our Trainers, Assessors, Facilitators, Education Supervisors and Award Coordinators. I would like to especially thank the 15 Club Chief Training Officers (CTO), some of whom took this role on for the first time this season, Ben McCormack (North Bondi), Greg Charles (Bondi), Phil Capps (Tamarama), Courtney Tallon & Andrew Ugarte (Bronte), Jessica Wheatley (Clovelly), Craig Howie (Coogee), George Benhayon (Maroubra), Cathie Hall (South Maroubra), Brett Furniss (Wanda), Cameron Simpson (Elouera), Jason Gollan (North Cronulla), Kerrie Hammell (Cronulla), Ian Brand (Era), Alex Flower (Burning Palms).

Our ongoing success in furthering the professional development of our members is from the wealth of knowledge and skill from Michael Hodsdon, Advance Awards Coordinator and his team of Facilitators who have dedicated their time and knowledge to ensure that members can continue to grow within surf lifesaving and apply their improved skills on the beach and in their everyday life. Our Advanced Awards team is also working incredibly hard to reduce the amount of face to face time for the Training Officer, Assessor and Silver Medallion Basic Beach Management awards. This will aid recruitment and retention of Trainers, Assessors and Patrol Captains once these courses have been perfected.

This season saw the number of Surf Rescue Certificates (SRC) remarkably increase from last season. The 414 new SRCs is a 5.9% increase from last season, this result is because of an absolutely amazing job from all 15 clubs in Sydney Branch. Thank you to all the trainers and assessors involved in the education of the future leaders of our organisation.

EDUCATION MANAGER

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Unfortunately we had a decline in our number of new Bronze Medallion/Certificate II In Public Safety awards. Our numbers dropped from 730 in the 2013-14 season to 698 this season which is a drop of 4.4%. Although this number has fallen slightly 698 new members patrolling our beaches is still a fantastic result. Many thanks need to go to our area education supervisors and their assistants for organising the assessing of these new members: Sam Wilson and Debbie Midwinter (Waverley), George Benhayon and Gabriella Quintana (Randwick), Kym Pennell and Scott Marshall (Bate Bay).

The higher award numbers for the 2014-15 season were a bit of a mixed bag again compared to last season. There was a 31% drop in ARTC, a 29% drop in Spinal Management, a 14% rise in IRB Drivers, a 16% rise in IRB Crew and a substantial drop in new Silver Medallion Basic Beach Management awards. This season we were also able to put through 60 new Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue new awards compared to none from the previous season. This is a wonderful result for a very popular award which is very lifesaving based. Although, for the most part our award numbers have dropped, this is a fantastic result which couldn't have been possible without the amazing work done by all our trainers and assessors. Keep up the great work!

Education Committees are not only about training new awards, but also about ensuring that our patrolling members are remaining proficient in a number of different awards. Below is a table which shows the proficiency numbers for the 15 clubs for the past two seasons. In the 4 awards we have had a significant increase in the number of active members remaining proficient in these awards:

DIRECTOR OF JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT REPORT



SLS Sydney Nippers proudly represent themselves on our beaches throughout summer, and every Nipper club in our Branch does a great job putting in thousands of hours to ensure our 7,000 Nippers across the Branch have an awesome time at all our beaches, and all learning to be young lifesavers.

Season 2014-15 saw 414 young Nippers become qualified Surf Lifesavers across the Branch, and this was supported by 414 parents obtaining their SLSA Age Managers award. These figures are great to see, and it means that our Nipper clubs are delivering to the clubs that train them, and that these young Australians will now go onto patrol and protect our beaches.

As a Branch we have now seen hundreds of Nipper Parents obtain their SLSA Age Managers award, with many clubs now having numbers in the 100's or even 200's across their Age groups. The impact of this can only be a very positive scenario for all our clubs, and the Nippers themselves, and we thank the clubs for this effort and continued focus.

For our U6's - U13's they obtained 5,400 Surf Education awards this season and this is a credit to the teams that have assisted in delivering this very important aspect of what we do at Nippers. Surf Ed has its impact forever, and knowing that our Nippers are learning and experiencing such a positive environment at the clubs is very encouraging.

Our Development Camp program continues to deliver in the long term, as we see past attendees winning major Lifesaving awards at our Branch Awards of Excellence event.

This season saw 194 Nippers and 43 parents attend the U11's and U13's Development camps in December and January. The Nippers who attend these camps continue to amaze us with their passion and understanding of surf lifesaving and what it means to them, and what they are hoping to achieve in the future.

This season was my second year in the position of Director of Surf Sports and I, along with the Board of Surf Sports (BOSS), continued with our clear primary focus of providing competition that was safe and efficient with carnival programs aimed at the contemporary needs of our competitors. Further review was undertaken in the off season which brought about a new format for the Cronulla Short Course Carnival, with a junior program in the morning and senior program in the afternoon. The North Cronulla Christmas Carnival program was amended with the introduction of the Steve Warren Cup that involved a focus on team events, while the Wanda Open Carnival saw the inclusion of the U12's, U13's and U14's. I will now highlight and expand further on other key aspects of the season.

Sydney Surf Sports Gala Day and Officials March Past Seminar

The 2014/15 season commenced in September with the 2nd annual Sydney Surf Sports Gala Day. Many thanks to North Cronulla SLSC for hosting the day. Activities held on the day included a 'Used Craft Sell, Swap and Buy' event, 3 separate surf sports clinics for ski, board and beach flags and the Official's Pre-season Briefing.

A new initiative this season was the 'Officials March Past Seminar' that was held at Maroubra. This initiative was coordinated by North Bondi's Grant McMahon with the assistance of Gary Cooke from Sydney Northern Beaches. Approximately 25 Sydney Officials attended the seminar and gained a greater insight into the technicalities of March Past judging. Special thanks must also go to Maroubra SLSC and the Maroubra Seals Club for their assistance on the day.

Interbranch Team

2014/15 season saw Surf Life Saving Sydney finish a very close second at the NSW Interbranch Championships with Sydney Northern Beaches taking out first place. 3. An 'Official of the Month' Award. Congratulations to Ron Hegarty, Tony Hughes, Kevin McNamarra, Amber Garcia, Craig Hawkings and Peter Burst for taking out this season awards.

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Club Carnivals

The Surf Life Saving Sydney calendar of carnivals was basically a repeat of previous seasons with most carnivals being held on their traditional weekends. The focus continued on streamlining programs to allow them to be conducted within a 4 to 5 hour time frame. Another initiative for the season was to incorporate male and female Over 40's races into all of the Open Carnivals.

Many thanks to the JAG based organising committees for continuing to a wonderful calendar of 'nipper carnivals' including the 4 District carnivals. This year we saw successful junior carnivals at Cronulla and South Maroubra with the Australia Day North Cronulla Ironman continuing to be a very popular event. Finally this season again saw two attempts by the Elouera JAG to hold their very successful Ohana Carnival, however on both occasions weather and surf conditions were not in their favour with the carnival eventually being cancelled for the season.

Masters Championships and Life Saving Championships

State and Australian Championships

This season again saw Sydney Branch competitors and clubs perform extremely well at both the State and Australian Championships. Congratulations must also go to all of U14 and U15 competitors who competed at the inaugural Australian Youth Championships. Some of the individual and team results by competitors were truly outstanding and too numerous to mention in this report other than a special congratulations to the Wanda SLSC who finished 2nd in the State Age Championships and 3rd in the Open Championships.

Combined Club Training Days

The season concluded with the introduction of 2 x Branch Combined Training days. Overall I am again extremely proud of what we, as a Branch, achieved in the 2014/15 season. I am exceptionally proud of our successful initiative to introduce the U17 and U19 Female Ski Relays, U19 Female Double Ski and U17 and U19 Female Belt races into the NSW State Championships. I truly believe we took further steps forward this season in hosting and managing surf sports events. COOGEE MINNOWS

At the beginning of this season we set ourselves a number of practical but ambitious goals. As outgoing Captain it is my responsibility and pleasure to report that with one exception we satisfied (and often exceeded) all of the applicable intentions. This has been another season of outstanding achievements in education, training, development and sporting excellence at Coogee Minnows.

We maintained membership at a manageable level (982 members) through a careful process of limiting the intake of new members in age groups other than the incoming U6 starters. We applied swim proficiency criteria at a higher level than the minimum applicable standard required by SLSNSW.

We organised and ran successful training and education programs through the season that resulted in 63 SRC graduates (99% pass rate), 209 Age Manager awards, 24 Bronze Medallion recipients, 8 Junior Official certificates, 45 Radio Operator awards.

We continued to grow our competition activities with coaching programs offered for water and sand events to selected kids who have been identified in greater numbers than ever before. We took large teams to Randwick Shield, South Maroubra, Branch and State Carnivals as supported carnivals through the season. We also sent a team of 9 individuals to the Aussie National Carnival from the U14 age group.

We enjoy continued and generous financial support from our sponsors. We should all remember these are local business people who deserve our consideration as a meaningful way of recognising their contributions that make an enormous difference. The 2014/15 season has been an important one for Elouera SSLC where we have aimed to continue our development in all areas of surf lifesaving.

Our membership has remained strong at over 1000 members including just under 600 nippers. These members have committed themselves to all areas of a lifesaving club very aware of the role it plays within our community and I am very proud of all members for their efforts in the last season.

In our 'core business', we have had a highly successful patrolling season thanks to all the hundreds of volunteers who committed so much in so many different ways to ensure the safety of our beach and the immediate surrounds.

Our patrols have remained strong throughout the season and this was evidenced by some outstanding statistics and inspection results. Rescues were quieter than in previous years; perhaps thanks to an increase in preventive activity.

This was the result of a wonderful team effort though the individual contribution by some members with a number of members patrolling well in excess of 100 hours and around 50 members gaining 100% patrol attendance.

Leading our patrols were 12 totally committed patrol captains who organized their teams superbly and led by example. Their contribution cannot be overstated.

In addition, a number of our members also provided significant support to Branch Support Operations including Surfcom, Jet Ski and Off-Shore Rescue Services. The contribution of Elouera's members to the District's Jet Ski operations was especially noteworthy, especially given that most of these drivers perform full patrol hours on top of their hours driving.

Again we hosted a number of boat carnivals this year as well as some branch training days. I am very proud to report that at all carnivals we maintained a patrolled public area as well as providing support to the carnivals. In doing so we worked smoothly with council lifeguards, as well as with the Branch's Director of Surf Sports, Wayne Druery and his team. The success of these carnivals is a testimony to all parties being able to work together for the benefit of all users of our beaches.

The rotation system continued until the end of the season and came to include a beach obstacle course to build agility.

The Surf Volley crew were invited to attend our beach to promote beach volley ball. The activity seemed popular with our nippers particularly our older age groups. In practice the crew were unreliable to work with and cancelled twice with short notice due to problems attracting coaches that are willing to travel to 'The Shire'. The idea of doing beach volley ball has merit, and we should consider doing more of this and having Surf Volley train some of our age managers.

During which they performed close to 150 rescues, 4331 preventative actions & treated close to 600 people for first aid.

We achieved just over 280 awards, with 41 Bronze Medallions and 31 SRC’s and an incredible 95 advanced awards thereby adding many new and better skilled members to bolster the strengths of patrols.

Our community events were again successful although foiled by the weather in some cases. The first of our community swims, the North Bondi Rival Rough Water Swim, had to be reduced to a 1km race due to large surf and blue bottles down the south end of the course. The North Bondi IGA Classic Ocean Swim was held in good conditions and the Bondi BareFoot run post-season was reasonably well attended. All events raise funds for us to maintain our service to the public.

Ben McCormack, in his second year as Head of Education, has exceeded all expectations. Ben was awarded the Club's Official of the Year for the 2014/15 Season. We achieved 407 Awards - the most in the Branch! As part of this we gained 121 Bronze Medallions and 51 SCR Awards. These results could not

have been achieved without Ben's dedicated team. With Jodie Salmon heading up the Bronze area and Glen Clark ensuring the SRC is coordinated properly, along with Paul Hotton and many more, this "TEAM" is fantastic and a real credit to Ben and their commitment to North Bondi.

This season our first day on patrol was on the 20th of September 2014 and we finished on the 26th of April 2015. Our active members carried out a total of 7990 voluntary patrolling hours on the beach, 490 hours of water safety with 722 preventative actions, 50 rescues, 59 first aid cases none of these requiring ambulances and a total of 18 beach closures due to surf conditions for the season. Our members can be very proud of their Vigilance and Service they provide for the beach going public.

Comparing the statistics from last season our rescues were under 50% of those recorded last season and our preventative actions down nearly 33% whilst our total patrolling hours were up by 540 hours. My thanks must go to Graham Hill who once again has stepped up to take on the role as Club Captain, a position that he has held many times before and brings a wealth of knowledge to this incredibly important role in our Surf Club. These very good statistics no doubt come from the hard work and hours he puts into this role which was harder this year as Graham did not have a Director of Lifesaving to help share the work load. Some of the highlights include:

LIFE SAVING AND SURF EDUCATION

At Wanda, we wanted to refocus on lifesaving this year. Aside from weekly programs with age managers, a new surf education team worked with age groups to expand our nippers life saving knowledge and skills. We look forward to growing this concept next season.

- We are extremely proud of Jed Buckley (winner) and Sarah Brown (finalist) in the Sydney Branch Junior Life Saver of the Year competition
- In total 38 kids - 95% our u14s (and a few u13s) gained their Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) and started regular patrols with Wanda.

SURF CONFIDENCE PROGRAMMES

To help build the confidence of nippers in the water, we introduced the Surf Confidence Program this year - a water area with special coaches and water safety, just for u9+ nippers who are hesitant in the surf. We can't wait to make this program bigger and better next year.

BUILD ON OUR STRONG SPORTING FOUNDATIONS:

There were several highlights from our surf sports team - headed by Sydney Branch Coach of the year, Dean McMahon. This included several Athlete of the Year awards & High Commendations at the Sydney Branch Awards held recently.

- Jock Athletic partnership. Jock Campbell and team are some of the best athletic coaches in the business - an absolute asset to Wanda Nippers.
- R&R. Wanda Nippers had an R&R team for the first time in many years. Six u14 girls formed the team. They competed in absolute style too - finishing 4th at State Age, and 5th at State Open.
- Zane Holmes Wave Warriors

We brought a new concept in carnivals to the Bate Bay beaches this year, in the Wave Warriors carnival. The exciting format and fast-pace event was a big hit & we've locked it in for early next season.

- Shannon Eckstein Clinic



The greatest Iron Man ever (quote from Trevor Hendy) brought his experience & know how to Wanda to share with our kids.

- Competition Excellence thanks to Dean McMahon

Surf sports is a significant part of Wanda Nippers - and this year we excelled beyond expectations. The highlight was our team finished second overall at the State Age championships, one of our best ever results. We can put this down to talented, hard working nippers, and Dean's dedicated coaching team including Rossi, Potty, Jock & Paul.

The importance of volunteers at Wanda Nippers can never be overstated. Each Sunday we have over 120 volunteers making it all happen - that's 1 in every 2 mums & dads. This year's group are fine young men and women, almost all who have become volunteer surf life savers - a credit to themselves, the club and families. Many have been with Wanda since a young age and we will certainly miss them.

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Surf Life Saving Sydney Incorporated is not a reporting entity because in the Executive Committees' opinion, there is unlikely to exist users who are unable to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically of their information needs and these financial reports are therefore a "Special Purpose Financial Report" that has been prepared solely to meet the financial reporting requirements under the Association's Constitution, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and the Associations Incorporation Act NSW.

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared with Australian Accounting Standards (including Australian Accounting Interpretations), and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account the changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Corporations Act 2001, and the following applicable accounting standards.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of this report, as described below, are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the Association's constitution, and with previous years.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Income Tax

No income tax is payable by Surf Life Saving Sydney Inc., as Section 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 exempts Charitable Institutions from Income Tax.

(b) Revenue and other income

- Sale of Goods: Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised when control of the goods has passed to the buyer, the amount of revenue can be measured reliably and it is probable that it will be received by the Association.

- Rendering of Services: When the outcome of the transaction involving the rendering of services can be

estimated reliably, revenue associated with the transaction is recognised by reference to the percentage of the services performed.

- Interest revenue: Interest revenue is recognised when received.

- Member subscriptions: Member subscriptions are recognised as revenue when received.

(c) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

(d) **Property, Plant and Equipment**

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are stated at historical cost less depreciation, Individual items costing less than \$1,000 are expensed immediately through the income statement rather than capitalised to the balance sheet. The depreciable amount of all fixed assets is charged over their life from the time the assets are purchased.

Property

Freehold land and property is measured at fair value by an independent valuer at regular intervals

The property is taken to be held for investment purposes and therefore the committee has adopted not to apply depreciation. Any adjustments in the value of the property will be made to the asset revaluation reserve. The current value of the property is \$2,006,592 with the last valuation being conducted on 31 May 2014.

Loans from the Building Society are secured by a registered first mortgage over the property.

Our audit did not involve an analysis of the prudence of business decisions made by members of the Executive Committee or management. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Independence

In conducting our audit, we have complied with the independence requirements of the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and the Associations Incorporations Act NSW 2009 which encompass the requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001*.

Independent Audit Report

Basis for Qualified Opinion

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practical for the club to maintain an effective system of internal control over donations, subscriptions and other fund raising activities until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, to this extent our audit was limited to the amounts recorded and banked. We are therefore unable to express an opinion on the completeness of the funds raised.

Qualified Auditor's Opinion

In our opinion, except for the effects on the financial report of the matter referred to in the qualification paragraph:

- (b) the financial report gives a true and fair view of the financial results of fundraising appeals during the financial year
- (c) any money received as a result of fundraising appeals conducted during the year ended 31 May 2015 has been properly accounted for and applied in accordance with the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and the Regulations thereto;
- (d) the financial statements and associated records have been properly kept during the financial year in accordance with provisions of the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and the Regulations thereto; and
- (e) at the date of this report, there are reasonable grounds to believe that Surf Life Saving Sydney incorporated will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due.
