<b>Summary</b>	Outline of the award categories, selection criteria and application processes for the Surf Life Saving Sydney (SLSS) Branch Awards of Excellence 2020/21
<b>Objective</b>	To recognise outstanding achievements and contributions from members and clubs in the 2020/21 season.
<b>Key Strategy Ref. No.</b>	2.5 - Encourage and promote recognition of volunteer's efforts to the wider community and external stakeholders
<b>Action</b>	Clubs are invited to submit <u>ONE</u> nomination per category to SLSS by <b>11.59pm Sunday 2 May 2021</b> . Nominations for <u>Surf Sports Awards</u> have an extended deadline of <b>9.00am Wednesday 5 May 2021</b> .

The Awards of Excellence recognises outstanding achievements and contributions across all aspects of Surf Life Saving. This year's awards presentation, which celebrates the accomplishments of members and clubs in the 2020/21 season, will take place on Saturday 29 May 2021 with further details to follow.

Changes have been made for the 2020/21 Awards as per SLSNSW Circular 3667:

1. SLSNSW has introduced a new award – Support Operations Member of the Year.
2. The Patrol of the Year Award has been removed – Note SLSS has kept this in as a Branch only award.
3. Youth Volunteer and Youth Surf Life Saver of the Year awards are open to members aged between 15-21.
4. Interviews form part of selection process for Youth Volunteer and Youth Surf Life Saver of the Year.
5. Surf Sports Team of the Year can represent any Surf Life Saving sporting discipline as defined in the Surf Sports Manual.

Clubs should consider collectively their nominees ensuring they meet the criteria of the specific award the Club wishes to nominate them for.

**It is important to note only one application will be accepted per club for each award category.**

## Section 1 - General Conditions

### General notes

- All nominees must be SLSA financial members (or affiliated organisations). Nominations should focus on activities during the 2020/21 SLS season, from 1 July 2020 – 30 June 2021.
- Where ages are mentioned, this refers to the members age as at 30 September in the 2020/21 season.
- Winners may be called upon to act as ambassadors of Surf Life Saving, both within the organisation and to external audiences.
- Paid employees at any level may apply for the awards listed. However, paid service will only be counted if applying for the Lifeguard of the Year or Coach of the Year awards. All other awards recognise voluntary contributions only.

### Guidelines for submission

- Applicants are required to complete and submit an online nomination form by **11.59pm Sunday 2 May 2021** for all award categories except Surf Sports. **Surf Sports Award Category nominations must be submitted by 9.00am Wednesday 5 May 2021.**
- Nominations will not be accepted via email or post. Applicants to contact Branch Office asap if they experience issues with the JotForm link.
- Applicants must address the criteria for their nominated award (found in Section 2 of Circular).
- Nominations are to include a digital profile image of the nominee (for individual awards) or logo (for group/team awards) via the online nomination form. Please ensure all nominee photographs are from the shoulders up and are of high resolution.

### Selection Process

- Finalists for the 'Surf Lifesaver of the Year', 'Volunteer of the Year', Youth Surf Lifesaver of the Year' and Youth Volunteer of the Year' will be required to participate in an online or face to face interview. Details of which will be available following the close of nominations.
- The selection panel will determine a winner from both a review of the application and the interview.
- Finalists from the remaining awards will be determined by a volunteer selection panel and will involve a review of applications.

### SLS Sydney Winners

- Winners of Awards listed in the 'SLSS Awards' list will be nominated for the SLSNSW Awards of Excellence. All SLS Sydney categories are aligned with SLSNSW/SLSA selection criteria, and as such winners are not expected to re-do applications following the SLSNSW Awards of Excellence.
- The SLSNSW Awards of Excellence will be held on Saturday 28 August 2021.
