SEMS users are required to have an active log in account to the Members Area (members.sls.com.au)

ALL Entries close at 4pm on Wednesday, 10th February 2021. No Late entries will be taken.

Boat Crews \$50.00 + GST per crew.

### 1.1 Boat Championship Entries

- SLSS may request clubs to reduce their entries if maximum event numbers are exceeded.
- All Crew members, Reserves Members and Sweeps must be entered into SEMS.

### 2. ENTRY CONDITIONS

### 2.1 Eligibility

Any competitor found to be a non-financial member, not proficient or not have the correct ageappropriate award will not be eligible to compete at the Branch Championships.

All competitors must be proficient by 31<sup>st</sup> December 2020 and have completed their patrol hour requirements. This must be reflected in SurfGuard for entry to be accepted in SEMS. Refer to Policy 5.04 (Competition Eligibility) for more information.

### 2.2 COVID Safety

The event is subject to a COVID-19 safety plan. A key component and one on which we seek cooperation is that competitors adopt the mantra: "Turn up, compete, leave".

All event attendees will be required to:

- Complete an online COVID safe declaration/check in on the day of the event using the QR code provided.
- Comply with the health directions of government and public health authorities as issued from time to time.
- Understand and act in accordance with COVID safety directions from SLSS as amended from time to time
- Comply with any testing and precautionary measures implemented by SLSS.
- Act with honesty and integrity regarding the state of their personal health and any potential symptoms; and
- Monitor their health and take a cautious approach to self-isolation and reporting of potential symptoms.

### 2.3 Club Representatives

Up to 5 representatives ["Team Manager/Coach"] per club will be permitted inside the competition area. It is a requirement that each team manager/coach be entered into SEMS (event contest 'Team Manager/Coach') prior to the carnival entries closing.



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### 2.3 Registration process / Wristbands

- All event attendees (competitors, team managers/coaches, officials and COVID marshalls) will need to report to the designated registration area before entering the competition area.
- A QR code will be displayed for attendees to complete the COVID-safe declaration/check-in.
- Once the declaration has been completed a wristband will be issued which must be worn for the duration of the competition.

### 3. VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

#### 3.1 Officials Quota

Clubs will be required to supply **1 official per 10 competitors**. Clubs need to be mindful that if they are sending large masters numbers that they include this in determining their official nomination numbers.

The online nomination form has closed so Clubs are to email <u>admin@surflifesavingsydney.com.au</u> if they need to update their nominations.

### 3.2 COVID Marshalls Quota

The COVID safety plan for the Boat Championships requires COVID Marshalls on the day of competition. Clubs are to provide 1 member who will be present at the carnival and who will undertake the role of COVID Marshall. There will be a COVID Safety Coordinator appointed to supervise their role and functions.

There is no objection to the load being shared by different members as long as at least one member is present from each Club. It is a requirement that each COVID Marshall be entered into the SEMS system (event contest 'COVID Marshall') prior to the carnival entries closing. Maximum of 3 will be allowed in the system.

### 3.3 IRB Requirements

The following Clubs have been rostered on to assist with IRB carnival water safety. Peter Burst is the Watercraft Coordinator for the Championships and all crews are to report to him. It is essential all crews report on time.

### 4. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

#### 4.1 Medal Presentations & Pointscores

Medals will be handed out at the completion of the final event of the Championships in the competition area.

Events will only be conducted with 2 or more crews entered in that event.

### N.B. 2 crews will be medal only and 3 or more will gain points.

- The Opens point score will include Lifesaving events, Boats, R&R, March Past along with water and beach events.
- A Masters point score will include water, beach and Boat events.
- For both opens and masters point scores only the Clubs first 2 teams in each event will be awarded points.

The Pointscore will be finalised at the conclusion of all Branch Championship Events.

### 4.2 Media Accreditation Form

Clubs are reminded of the importance of <u>Member Protection and Safeguarding</u>. In line with the <u>SLSA Policy 6.21 - Photography</u> Sydney Branch adopts a media accreditation procedure for Club Photographers and Media Agencies intending to access Branch Carnivals.
