The Awards of Excellence recognises outstanding achievements and contributions across all aspects of Surf Life Saving. This year's awards presentation, which celebrates the accomplishments of members and clubs in the 2021/22 season, will take place on Saturday 28 May 2022 at the ICC with further details to follow.

Changes have been made for the 2021/22 awards as per [SLSNSW Circular 3706](#)

1. SLSSA have updated the wording for the Community Education Award
 2. Additional 'criteria pointers' have been added to assist in applications for Coach and Official nominations.
- Note that there has been no change to sport award criteria or age cut offs due to an ongoing Sport category review at SLSSA, which has now been pushed to the 2023 season.

Section 1 - General Conditions

General notes

- All nominees must be SLSA financial members (or affiliated organisations). Nominations should focus on activities during the 2021/22 Surf Life Saving season, from 1 July 2021 – 30 June 2022.
- Where ages are mentioned, this refers to the members age as at 30 September in the 2021/22 season.
- Winners may be called upon to act as ambassadors of Surf Life Saving, both within the organisation and to external audiences.
- Surf Life Saving NSW State team events or teams will not be considered for nomination for these awards.
- Paid employees at any level may apply for the awards listed. However, paid service will only be counted if applying for the Lifeguard of the Year or Coach of the Year awards. All other awards recognise voluntary contributions only. Unless otherwise specified, these awards are in recognition of individual achievement tea submissions will not be considered

Guidelines for submission

- Applicants are required to complete and submit an online nomination form by **11.59pm Sunday 1 May 2022** for all award categories.
- Nominations will not be accepted via email or post. Applicants to contact Branch Office asap if they experience issues with the JotForm link.
- Applicants must address the criteria for their nominated award (found in Section 2 of this Circular).
- Nominations are to include a digital profile image of the nominee (for individual awards) or logo (for group/team awards) via the online nomination form. Please ensure all nominee photographs are from the shoulders up and are of high resolution.

Selection Process

- Finalists for the 'Surf Lifesaver of the Year', 'Volunteer of the Year', Youth Surf Lifesaver of the Year' and Youth Volunteer of the Year' will be required to participate in an online or face to face interview following the close of nominations. Details of which will be available following the close of nominations.
- The selection panel will determine a winner from both a review of the application and the interview.



- Finalists from the remaining awards will be determined by a volunteer selection panel and will involve a review of applications.

SLS Sydney Winners

- Winners of Awards listed in the 'SLSS Awards' list will be nominated for the SLSNSW Awards of Excellence. All SLSS categories are aligned with SLSNSW/SLSA selection criteria, and as such winners are not expected to re-do applications following the SLSNSW Awards of Excellence.
- The SLSNSW Awards of Excellence will be held on Saturday 27 August 2022 at Luna Park, Milsons Point.
