General Supplementary Carnival Rules

All events will be run in accordance with the 37th Edition of the Surf Sports Manual with all rules, regulations, and by-laws.

Competition shall be conducted as per the current edition SLSA Surf Sports Manual except where detailed in this section.

All Crews are to register on the day of the carnival prior to competing.

All competitors be wearing Fluorescent-coloured singlet as their outer layer of clothing when entering the water Courses for all events, may vary at the discretion of the Carnival Referee in consultation with the

Competition Committee and Sydney Branch Boat Panel.

Additional Local Rules

Rule 1 -

A sweep will be able to sweep another club's (in addition to his own) crews, if required in his/her own Club's boat or the other clubs at the sweep's discretion (providing the sweep is not sweeping an existing crew in the same division). The crew would be entitled to Boat Series Points - minus 20% of points awarded.

** In addition, specific to the Skins Carnival on 22 October, that a sweep from the same club (preferably), be able to sweep additional crew/s if the crews were to be drawn in the same race i.e., Sweep A steers his Open Men's Crew and U/23 Men's Crew, they both qualify for the last 6 boats. Sweep A cannot steer both so Sweep B is sought and steers one of the crews until either is knocked out.*

Rule 2 -

The boat panel has the right to choose the format of racing on the day considering surf conditions, although every effort will be made to notify competitors and officials of the format at the earliest opportunity. e.g., flat days perhaps have longer racing (1K) with harsher cuts or good clean surf days race short course with softer cuts to allow more time spent in the surf. This will not apply to the State Selection Carnival at North Cronulla nor the Branch Championships where normal racing will apply.

Rule 3

U/23 rowers can row in the junior category, on condition that they do not exceed the combined age of 76 years, providing that no member of the crew is older than the U/23 Category and that there are no more than 2 overage rowers in the crew. e.g., two 16-year-old can form a crew with two 20-year-old

Rule 4 -

Allowances to be made for crews to be made up of rowers from varying clubs all rowers must be financial for the 2023/2024 season and to compete for their own club i.e., 2 rowers from one club, 2 rowers from another club + 1 sweep. All to gain points for that specific crew. Entry fees to be paid by own club.

Rule 5 –

Point score to be in accordance with the Surf Sports Manual system i.e., 10 points for 1st, 9 for 2nd.

Traffic Management Plan - Boat Access to Beach

Weather and conditions allowing, we propose the carnival will be held just north of Wanda Surf Club, in the vicinity of beach access gate #8.

It is expected that there will be approximately 400 competitors at the Wanda Boat Carnival.

Boat trailers will be driven to the end of the Greenhills Carpark and unhitched from their vehicles. Boat access to the beach will be either via gate #6 (adjacent to the lifeguard tower) or gate #7. Boats can then be either rowed or carried to the competition area. All tents, oars and equipment should also be unloaded at this location and carried down to the competition area.

Trailers will be parked in the Don Lucas Reserve in between tracks 6 and 7. Dedicated traffic spotters (in hi-vis) will direct the vehicles bumping in and out as well as advising public and to ensure that all is done safely. Towing vehicles will be parked in either the carpark if spaces are available or elsewhere. No provision for parking of any vehicles will be allowed for by carnival organisers.

Access details for parking (including three-hour parking restrictions) and trailer unloading and storage will be distributed to all clubs involved via the final carnival circular.
